

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

At home



- Do not open the door to immigration agents (ICE) or any police officer that does not have a search warrant **signed by a judge**. (Immigration agents almost never have one.)
 - Ask them to slide the warrant under the door or hold it up to the window.
 - To be valid, the order has to have your correct name, your address, and the signature of a judge.
 - Say, "I am not going to open the door without first consulting with an attorney."
 - Consult an immigration attorney.
 - If possible, you should make a video of what is happening on your cell phone.

On the street



- Before answering any questions, ask: "Am I free to leave?"
 - If they say yes, then you should leave and respectfully say, "I do not want to answer any questions."
 - If they say no, say, "I want to exercise my right to remain silent. I want to talk to an attorney."
 - Do not sign any paper without first consulting with an attorney.
 - Consult an immigration attorney.

What to carry?



YES

- If you have them, carry your residency card, DACA, or work permit.
- Carry documents that show you have lived in the United States more than 2 years.
- Carry the phone number of your immigration attorney and ask your attorney what you should carry with you.

NO

- Do not carry any type of documents from your country of origin.
 - Do not carry any false identification or documents.

How to prepare?



- Find out your immigration options. Consult an immigration attorney.
 - Know your rights.
 - Make a plan of care for your children.
 - Talk to your children about your plan and your rights.
